Over the course of 5 weeks, ALC facilitated Summer Musical Theatre programs at 7 different schools across SoCal that were hugely successful for our ALC staff and their incredible students!





This summer was a tremendous success in fostering creativity and confidence among our students through our innovative program that merged arts education with a learning adventure!

SUMMER MUSICAL THEATRE CONTINUED

This year, ALC put down roots in El Monte, CA at Maxson and Monte Vista elementary school. We were also incredibly fortunate to partner with Think Together, the renowned community-oriented organization that has been instrumental in providing after-school programming to schools across California. Together our organizations were able to pilot a brand-new Musical Theatre /Technical Theatre program designed to work in tandem to give students an in-depth and hands-on production experience. Students involved in our Technical Course were taught the basics of lighting, sound and scenic design and were shown how to analyze scripts as a theatre designer. This class worked with the students in our traditional Musical Theater course, culminating in a production performed by and ran by the students themselves.

Focusing on the technical program and what the students were able to accomplish here is the goal, since it was the brand-new program that we piloted. Mad Hamaguchi was the teacher for that program that wrote the curriculum for it and ran it.

After a very successful school year with Newport Mesa Unified School District, we were thrilled to once again join them for their Summer Camp programs to tackle "The Jungle Book"! With the help of our amazing Teaching Artists, final performances dazzled audiences with outstanding displays of talent & costume pieces and set decor that were hand made by the students themselves. A particular standout performance was that of the ensemble at Lincoln Elementary School, whose entire cast was made up of only 6 actors to portray 20+ characters on stage! Despite the added challenge, the kids came together to put on an absolutely amazing performance for their audience.

Arts & Learning Conservatory could not be prouder of these amazing students and their dedication to the performing arts.

THRILLED TO SHARE THE LATEST UPDATE

ALC is thrilled to share the latest updates from one of our talented alumni, Philip Sheegog! Cellist Philip Sheegog pushes the boundaries of genre with a technical versatility, fearless commitment, and extroverted generosity that have marked him as one of the pioneering voices on the border of contemporary classical and mainstream music. Co-founder of the electroacoustic string duo ARKAI, Sheegog fuses the sonic traditions and technical vocabulary of his native classical with cutting-edge sound design, live audio processing, and myriad genre influences to create a distinctively modern synthesis. ARKAI's captivating singularity has led to collaborations with such disparate artists as American photographer David LaChappelle, Asian-American artist-activist Amanda Phingbodhipakkiya, GRAMMY-winning vocalist Gallant, Haitian superstar Emeline



Michel, and world-champion beatbox duo SPIDERHORSE. He has represented the Recording Academy (GRAMMYs) through featured performances at the Culture Summit Abu Dhabi and GRAMMYs On The Hill in Washington D.C., and brought music to underserved audiences around the world through the U.S. Department of State's American Music Abroad program.

Additional past engagements have included performances at the MET Museum, US Air Force Academy, World Trade Center, Lincoln Center, Carnegie Hall and TED, and opening for Oscar and GRAMMY-winning musician Jon Batiste at NYC's Javits Center.


